

## 360 S. 3rd Street

This one story residence is rectangular in plan and has a low pitched intersecting gable roof with wide eaves, exposed rafters and composition shingles. The exterior is covered with weatherboard siding with a slightly flared base. A concrete foundation supports the building. The windows are fixed pane and casement windows in bays. There is a polygonal bay window on the south elevation. The projecting gable roof porch has truncated stucco supports. There is a stucco chimney. The building faces east on South Third Street and is in excellent condition. There is a two car garage associated with the structure. The building has a gable roof and is covered with weatherboard. The building was constructed by Ira Mix, the president of the First National Bank of Independence.
