Intersection at 4th and C Street is Now an All-Way Stop



The intersection of 4th and C Street, right by Independence Elementary School, is now an all-way stop-controlled crossroad. Traffic Control Change Ahead signs, supplemental stop bars, road paint, and fold-out stop signs have been posted.

The fold-out signs will remain in place for the next two weeks, and the Traffic Control Change signs will remain in place for 90 days.

The City of Independence urges residents to be aware when driving through this area as we work to increase the safety of our students during and after school operating hours.

Community Development Update



Several items move through the Independence Community Development Department in any given month. This section of River City Briefs showcases some of the projects that are occurring in the community.

- Independence Housing Needs Analysis Work has begun on the Independence Housing Needs Analysis. The project, funded through a grant received from the Oregon Department of Land Conservation and Development, will consider housing needs in Independence over the next 20 years, and break the housing need into various types and prices. Strategies to promote affordable and available housing to all income levels will also be identified through the process. A kickoff presentation for the project will be made to a joint meeting of the Planning Commission and the City Council at the City Council meeting on August 9, 2022 and a community survey about the project will be sent out within the next couple of weeks.
- Monmouth-Independence Trolley Project Work continues on the trolley project. Vehicles have been ordered and stop locations have been identified. Progress is additionally being made on the branding for the service. Expect more information about the service and a survey to request feedback about the branding soon.

In addition to these projects, the department has been at work on the following development code change:

 Changes to Garage Requirements – At the City Council meeting of August 9, the Council will consider a code change that would modify the requirements for garages. The changes would no longer require new single-family homes and duplexes to have a garage and would allow individuals to convert their garages to habitable space, so long as certain conditions are met. 
race produces substantial economic benefit throughout the region, along with an innovative partnership with local charities that provides hundreds of

Places by the Sea Exhibit Featured at Independence Heritage Museum



In 1910, visiting Oregon's destinations by the sea wasn't an easy trip. Trunks were pulled down from the attic, bathing suits aired and repaired. Bed linens, clothing, toys, and cooking utensils were packed. The adventure was at least a week long and it could last all summer. Vacationers rented cottages, camped, or stayed in hotels dotting the coast.

The photos on display were taken between 1906 and 1920 and showcase the Oregon coast as a place of bustling activity while also being filled with solitude. The messages accompanying the photographs are small stories inspired by coastal postcards found in the Oregon Historical Society collections.

Come check it out - admission is always free; donations are welcome. The Heritage Museum is open Tuesday - Thursday 10 AM - 6 PM, Friday & Saturday 10 AM - 4 PM, and closed on Sunday & Monday.
