## New City Manager Addresses Independence Residents




The City of Independence would like to officially welcome our new city manager Kenna West, JD to our community. Read Kenna's welcome address here:

# **Community Development Update**

Several items move through the Independence Community Development Department in any given month. This section of River City Briefs showcases some of the projects that are occurring in the community.

- Liberty Place 3 and Brandy Meadows 3 Subdivisions The plats for the Liberty Place 3 and Brandy Meadows 3 subdivisions were recently signed. The plats, the legal documents that officially create lots, would create 29 new lots in the final phase of the Liberty Place subdivision and would create 32 new lots in Brandy Meadows. Expect new building in the areas soon.
- Monmouth-Independence Trolley Project Work continues on the trolley project. Vehicles have been ordered and stop locations have been identified. Additionally, progress is being made on the branding for the service. Expect more information and requests for feedback about the branding soon.

In addition to these projects, the department has been at work on two potential development code changes:

- Duplex Standards At the City Council meeting of July 12, the Council will consider a code change that would allow duplexes on all lots zoned for single-family use. This change would address recent legislation passed by the State of Oregon that requires all cities that are larger than 10,000 individuals in size, to provide "missing middle housing" options including the allowance "the development of a duplex on each lot or parcel zoned for residential use that allows for the development of detached single-family dwellings." (see House Bill 2001)
- Changes to Garage Requirements At the Planning Commission meeting of July 11, the Commission will consider a code change that would modify the requirements for garages. The changes would no longer require new single-family homes and duplexes to have a garage and would establish a set of standards for alternative parking configurations.

Garage Conversion Code Change to be Considered at Upcoming Planning Commission Meeting



Daniel Alvarado wasn't always looking to convert his garage into a bigger living space, but, as with anything, necessary growth requires adaptable solutions.

After moving back to Independence from West Salem, Daniel bought his home in 2013 under conditions that were less than ideal.

"The place was a dump," shared Daniel.

Upon discovering his need to expand his garage, Daniel contacted the Community Development Department at the City of Independence. Soon after, they told him his garage conversion blueprints were not in accordance with the current city code. Daniel was then encouraged to attend a planning commission meeting to tell his story and advocate for an amendment to the current garage building code.

Now, with the next planning commission meeting set for Monday, July 11, at 7 PM in the Independence Civic Center, a proposed change to the garage conversion code is on the docket.
