


It is officially summer in Independence, Oregon!

Hot Patching Completed on Monmouth Street



This week and last, work crews from the Oregon Department of Transportation were seen hot patching on Monmouth Street, also known as OR-51 in Independence, Oregon.

Workers used a gas burner and a propane tank to heat the asphalt surface for better bitumen adhesion. This process is intended to help prevent the bonding from significant asphalt pavement damage.

The City of Independence offers thanks to the work crews from ODOT for helping improve the traffic safety and flow on our town's busiest street.
