
Building Department Update

Several items move through the Independence Community Development Department in any given month. This section of River City Briefs showcases some of the projects that are occurring in the community.

- Central Plaza Tenant Improvement Improvements continue to be made to the Central Plaza Shopping Center. Signs are up for the new Grocery Outlet, and improvements inside the building are nearing completion.
- Monmouth-Independence Trolley Project Work continues on the trolley project. Vehicles have been ordered and stop locations are in the process of being finalized. Additionally, progress is being made on the branding for the service. A recent survey of community residents helped narrow potential names for the trolley to I&M (the historic name for the railroad that traveled between the two communities) and Mindy. A name written in several times on the survey MI Trolley is also being considered. Service is expected to begin sometime before the end of the year.


MINET Seeks New General Manager
