Several items move through the Independence Community Development Department in any given month. This section of River City Briefs showcases some of the projects that are occurring in the community.

- Brandy Meadows Construction in Phase 2 of the Brandy Meadows Subdivision, near 9th and Chestnut, continues. 28 lots have received permits in the 35-lot phase and four of the new homes have been occupied. The phase is primarily slated to be new single-family homes and duplexes. Installation of the infrastructure for Phase 3 of Brandy Meadows is also nearly complete.
- Osprey Point Work on the mixed-use building at 75 C Street continues. The building, which will feature ground-floor retail space and 36 apartments above, has started installing interior finishes.

Key upcoming projects include a review of the Wastewater System Facilities Plan. The Independence Planning Commission will review the document at their meeting on February 7, 2022.

The Wastewater System Facility Plan is a 20-year planning document that outlines improvements to the City's sanitary sewer collection and treatment systems. The last master plan was completed in 2014 and this plan would update the document to remain current with the community's wastewater needs.

The Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting, and its attainment represents a significant accomplishment by a government and its management.
