The Independence Public Library

Organized in 1908 and legally established in 1909 the library was housed in a storefront in Main Street. It then moved to a building on Monmouth Street, and in 1929, the Independence Public Library moved to a new building designed to be a library. At that time the collection held fewer than 2,000 volumes and the city had a population of fewer than 2,000 folks.

This original library building is still part of the Independence Library system and can be seen at:

311 Monmouth Street, Independence

The Friends hold their book sales at this site as well as share space with the active new community Visitors Center.

In the year 2000, voters in Independence approved a bond for a new library. After much public input, extensive planning, and vigorous fundraising, the brand new Library opened in September 2003, with over 27,000 volumes which has grown to over 47,000 items, including books and AV items. This new library provides almost five times more space plus a meeting room used by many local groups and organizations.
