Safe Exchange Zones Now Available at Independence Civic Center



Have you heard of a Safe Exchange Zone?

Dallas, Monmouth, and Independence now have dedicated zones that are safe and secure (24-hour video surveillance) for residents to conduct personal

exchanges, such as child custody, or e-commerce transactions, such as buy/sell/trade. Each Safe Exchange Zone has two parking spots for a buyer and seller, or two custodial units, to park side-by-side and feel comfortable that their exchange will be conducted safely.

The Safe Exchange Zone in Independence zone is located at the Independence Civic Center (555 S Main St, Independence) near the south entrance.

Independence Highlighted in Recent Oregonian Article

Steve Tabler of Monmouth used to drive to work every morning, but now he just hops on the trolley.

He never worries about missing it. The trolley isn't going anywhere without him.

After 14 years of commuting to Salem to drive the city's Cherriots buses, Tabler now drives



one of three little red trolleys back and forth 36 times per day between Western Oregon University in Monmouth and Riverview Park in Independence.

There is a lot to see along the three-mile journey each way, Tabler said. "It's something that Monmouth and Independence have needed for a long time," he said.

He grew up in Monmouth-Independence and said the 21st century has been kind to the two communities. The trolley, which started service April 2 with \$3 million from the American Rescue Plan Act, is the latest in a 20-year wave of economic and cultural transformations, particularly evident in Independence.

Heritage Museum to Host "Fire and Freedom: Food and Enslavement in Early America" Exhibit




The National Library of Medicine produced Fire and Freedom: Food and Enslavement in Early America, along with the companion website, with guest curator, historian, author, and educator Psyche Williams-Forson, PhD (University of Maryland, College Park). It is on view at the Heritage Museum from June 5, 2023 to July 15, 2023.

The traveling exhibition and companion website explore ways in which meals can tell us how

power is exchanged between and among different peoples, races, genders, and classes. In the Chesapeake region during the colonial era, European settlers relied upon indentured servants, Native Americans, and enslaved Africans for labor, life-saving knowledge of farming and food acquisition, and to gain economic prosperity. Fire and Freedom looks into life at George Washington's Mount Vernon plantation and the labor of enslaved workers to learn about the ways that meals transcend taste and sustenance.
