

 All fences must be located on your property. Fences in City right-of-way are not allowed (the City is not available to help determine property lines). Applicants are required to call 881 for locates. Fence Heights: Must meet all vision clearance requirements (per IDC 74.005(C)) at streets and alleys. In the front yards of residential uses, fences cannot exceed 3 and ½ feet in height, unless constructed of a non-sight obscuring material. Fences otherwise enclosing residential uses must be at least eight (8) feet tall if topped with barbed wire or other injurious material. 			t a. b. er c. d. s 5. C. 6. O. in	codes.6. FENCE STANDARDS

Illustrated



- A For side and rear yards, fences typically cannot exceed 84 inches in height.
- **B** For vision clearance areas (shown in gray), fences typically cannot exceed 42 inches in height. Vision clearance areas are determined by measuring:
 - -10 feet from the property corner at the intersection of an alley and a street .
 - -20 feet from the property corner at the intersection of streets.
- **C** For front yards, fences typically cannot exceed 42 inches in height.

Please note. Fences are only allowed on private property. Please ensure that your fence is placed on your land, and not in the City right-of-way. The City right-of-way may include streets, landscaping strips, power poles, and City utilities. City right-of-way does not necessarily stop directly behind the sidewalk.
