The park project will include installing Nature Play Equipment and seating suitable for picnicking by small groups such as picnic tables. A safety surface (engineered wood fiber or similar) will also be installed. The installation will include concrete work to tie the project location into the existing trail infrastructure and connect individual site elements. Funded through grants and System Development charges, this park will bring to

fruition the vision expressed by our community during the 2015 Parks Master Plan, creating an important new amenity for families in one of our city's newest neighborhoods.

Construction of the park is set to start this month and continue until October 2024.



Radiant Rocks: Unveiling the Hidden Glow of Fluorescent Minerals

"Radiant Rocks: Unveiling the Hidden Glow of Fluorescent Minerals" is making its debut at the Heritage Museum. Local rock hound and Clackamette Mineral and Gem club member, Bob Oblack, worked with local carpenter and contractor, Ken Fetters, to bring this exhibit to Independence.

Fluorescent minerals are captivating. Unlike common materials that reflect ultraviolet light, these minerals emit light from within themselves. The enchanting hues they radiate are unique to each mineral, tied to its distinct physical and chemical composition.

Usually, a small amount of impurity, or activator, must be present for the mineral to fluoresce. Pure minerals typically don't exhibit fluorescence, with the shimmering exception of gold.

The intensity of these colors is due to the concentration of these activators. The interplay of fluorescence transforms into a symphony of hues, revealing the concealed beauty that naturally resides in these extraordinary minerals.


