City Addresses Customer Concerns Over Higher Water Bills as New Meter System Enhances Accuracy



The city is currently transitioning its aging inventory of water meters to newer, more accurate, and more reliable meters supporting the most accurate billing for our water customers. We have experienced some challenges in this effort including technical issues translating meter readings to consumption and billing statements.

The city recently installed approximately 500 of the new, updated meters. Some customers identified significant increases in billed consumption for the August billing period relative to prior months. As a result, the city researched those accounts and tested a sample of the new meters to ensure they were measuring accurately. Contributing to the high consumption was the timeline for meter installation and reading those meters.

The guidelines for Recorder of the Year state any OAMR member, City Manager, or Mayor may submit a confidential nomination to acknowledge recorders and recognize their excellence and professional accomplishments. The nominee must have made an outstanding contribution or performed outstanding service to OAMR, to the profession of Municipal Recorder, or to an individual city during the association fiscal year. This award recognizes outstanding service and performance over and above the person's job description. Some possible strengths might include areas such as Public Relations, Records Management, Legislative or Council Procedures, or even a special project.

Temporary Mid-Block Crossings Yield Impressive Data



The city of Independence recently removed the temporary crosswalks installed on Monmouth Street.

The crosswalks were part of a demonstration project in collaboration with the Oregon Department of Transportation to study how many people would use the crossings if available. Detailed counts

of the use of the crossings were conducted one day during the demonstration. On that day, 728 crossings occurred at the three crosswalks – 642 at the crossing by the high school, 64 by Waremart, and 24 on 13th Street.

The data collected demonstrates the importance of additional improved crossings and will be used to design permanent crossings and apply for grants in the future.

Permanent Ballot Box Now Available Outside Independence Civic Center

A permanent Polk County ballot drop box has been installed outside the Independence Civic Center. Ballots for the upcoming election will begin mailing out on October 16, 2024.

To ensure your vote is counted, any ballots returned to an Official Drop Site must be received by 8 p.m. on Election Night, November 5, 2024.
